CASE for Refugees is a non-government, non-religious community legal centre that provides migration and general legal services to the culturally and linguistically diverse (CaLD) communities of Western Australia.

Since its establishment in 2002, CASE for Refugees has provided migration assistance to hundreds of refugees seeking residency in Australia.

Legal Advice

In 2009 CASE for Refugees began providing members of the culturally and linguistically diverse communities of Western Australia with a free general legal service.

General legal advice and referrals

Advice

Initial advice on general legal issues is provided to CaLD community members in one-off interviews. Additional appointments may occur for more complex matters.

Referrals

If we are unable to assist you we will, wherever possible, refer you to a community legal centre that is equipped to handle your specific legal problem.

Casework

In limited circumstances CASE for Refugees will represent you in Courts and Tribunals.

Interpreters

We use accredited interpreters at our information sessions and during client interviews.

Information

CASE for Refugees runs information sessions on a variety of legal topics.

Confidential

All our services remain totally confidential. There are strict privacy laws that protect people's privacy.

Funding

In 2009 CASE for Refugees received Federal Government funding that enabled us to extend our legal services from migration advice to provision of general legal assistance to members of the CaLD communities.

Independence

CASE for Refugees is not connected to the Department of Immigration (DIMIA) or any other government department.

A free service

All services provided are free of charge, although we do accept donations towards the cost of our work.
